PRO TIPS - ROGER KEATING

Want to improve ? Step out of your comfort zone !

Everyone has a game style which they prefer to use, especially under pressure. Some people are more comfortable at the baseline and others would prefer to be at the net. If you take a good look at your game and you fall into one of these categories then it might be time to step out of your comfort zone and get a little closer to that all court game style. This will keep your opponent guessing and open up a lot more possibilities for you on the tennis court. One way to implement this is to give yourself mini performance goals next time you play your match. If you tag yourself as a baseliner.....maybe you can make yourself serve and volley 5 times during the match just to catch your opponent off guard (especially when they are just chipping the return back) If you don't feel comfortable with the serve and volley you can go into your next match with the strategy of forcing yourself to go to the net to finish the point every time you are up 40-0 in a game. Giving yourself these performance goals will help you to step outside your comfort zone and you will be well on your way to that all court game style.
